

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
PORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS: The Tribal Council in Special Session this 19th day of November, 1940 have duly considered and hereby approved the following appropriation from I.I.M. funds.

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council heretofore has recommended to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs an appropriation of tribal funds of \$5,500 for a gymnasium at the Cibecue school for the benefit of the Cibecue Indians.

AND WHEREAS it now develops that a building satisfactory to the Indians of the Cibecue District cannot be constructed for that amount in which to hold various forms of meetings and recreation, bathing facilities, etc.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Port Apache Indian Agency forward this resolution to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs with his recommendation for an allotment of an additional \$5,500 from the I.I.M. funds to add to the appropriation already available, making a total appropriation of \$11,000 for this building; and that this building be located on the campus of the Cibecue Day School; that it be constructed of stone to harmonize with the other buildings recently constructed and that Indian labor insofar as possible, with the exception of perhaps a foreman, be employed in the construction of this project.

The foregoing resolution was on November 19, 1940, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) and of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
