

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Dr. Emil W. Haury, Head of the Department of Anthropology, at the college of Liberal Arts, University of Arizona, has made application to continue archaeological work on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in the Forestdale District where similar work was conducted during the past year pursuant to the provisions of the act for the preservation of American antiquities, approved June 8, 1906 (34 Sta. 225), and the interdepartmental regulations promulgated thereunder.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular session this Seventh day of April, 1941, that the applicant on behalf of the University of Arizona, be permitted to conduct archaeological work in the same district during the summer months of 1941, under such rules and conditions as the Secretary of the Interior may prescribe.

The foregoing resolution was this 7th day of April, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 1(c) Art. VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
