RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS: The Tribal Council is regular session this 5th day of April, 1941, having duly considered the request of the Agricultural Extension Agent and the favorable resommendation of Mr. John T. Montgomery, Supervisor of Extension Work for the South-western Area and being conversant with the desire of the Extension personnel to improve the breeding of our tribal purebred herd and to make possible the registration of the offspring of the animals in this herd by the use of the artificial insemination method which we believe to be the only practicable method of accomplishing this under our range conditions, and being in full sympathy with these objectives and desirous of adopting a breeding program similar to that which has produced such outstanding results on the San Carlos Reservation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESCLVED that the Tribal Council approve the request of the Extension Department for the expenditure of the sum of \$9,000 for the construction, equipping and operation of an artificial insemination plant and for the care and maintenance and other expenses of the Tribal Purebred Herd in accordance with the attached budget;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency request the Secretary of the Interior through the Office of Indian Affairs to approve the expenditure of the above amount from Individual Indian Money, White Mountain Apache Account now on deposit to the credit of the tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on May 5, 1941 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apachs Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of Interior on August 28, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
