GESOLUTION OF THE VHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date <u>July 14, 1941</u> that:

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council in regular session this 14th day of July, 1541, having duly considered the request of one of its members, namely. Lester Oliver of the Seven Mile District, for the expenditure of not to exceed \$5,000 of tribal funds, for the construction of a small council house, laundry and shower bath combined, for the benefit of the Seven Mile Indians.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council approve the request of Lester Oliver for the expenditure of the above amount for the construction and equipping of such a building in the Seven Mile District, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of the Fort Apacha Indian Agency request the Secretary of the Interior, through the Office of Indian Affairs, to approve the expenditure of the above amount from Individual Indian Money, White Mountain Apacha Account now on deposit to the credit of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was this 14th day of July , 1941, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and O against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (d) and (e) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on august 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on august 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
