

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date December 1, 1941 that:

WHEREAS, the Council has again reviewed the Law and Order Code as adopted on June 23d by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council and including the various amendments made in departmental letter of September 5, 1941 and approved by the Council in its letter of October 17, 1941, signed by the Chairman:

THEREFORE BE IT NOW RESOLVED that the Code as above approved be in full force and effect and that copies be printed and distributed to the various sections of the reservation for the information of members of the Tribe, and that copies also be supplied to all the schools on the reservation so all tribal members, young and old, may become familiar with the Law and Order Regulations of the Reservation and govern themselves accordingly.

The foregoing resolution was on December 1, 1941 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (g, i, k) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
