RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVET by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 9th day of March, 1942, That:

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is indebted to the United States Government in the amount of \$6,362.69 because of the purchase of livestock to improve the tribal cattle and horses, this indebtedness being represented by a balance due on reimbursable agreement Mo. 1367, dated September 1, 1947, in the amount of \$5,453.01 and tribal reimbursable agreement No. 1321, dated March 19, 1937, in the amount of \$909.68, and

Whereas, the tribe has sufficient funds in the tribal Individual Indian Money Account to meet this indbatedness derived from Livestock activities, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVET, that this obligation be paid from tribel funds to our credit and the Superintendent is hereby authorized to issue a check against the tribal account in settlement thereof, subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior.

The foregoing resolution was this 9th day of March 1942, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (a), Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 14, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
