RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this first day of June, 1942, that

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council under date of December 1, 1941 approve: a Tribal Grazing Permit, numbered 14, for W.A. Ryan of Globe, Arizona to hold and graze on tribal land of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for a period of three (3) years beginning June 1, 1942 and terminating not later than October 1, 1944, 5400 head of sheep at an annual rate of 30% per head. The annual grazing period being from June 1 to October 1 of each year, and

WHEREAS, W. A. Ryan has made formal request by letter under date of April 29, 1942 that he be permitted to transfer or assign his grazing permit to the Paradise Sheep Company of Chandler, Arisona, owing to his ill health, and

WHEREAS, the Paradise Sheep Company has submitted a certified check for \$810,00, being one-half the annual grazing fees as a guarantee in lieu of the sureties required in the above mentioned permit, and being otherwise satisfied that the Paradise Sheep Company of Chandler, Arizona, desires to assume the responsibilities of fulfilling the requirements of the grasing permit,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council approve the request of Mr. Ryan and hereby consent to the assignment of this permit to the Paradise Sheep Company as heretofore stated.

The foregoing resolution was on June 1, 1942 duly adopted by a vote of ten or and none against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984).
