

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date September 9, 1942 that:

WHEREAS, the Interior Bill for the fiscal year 1943 carried an appropriation for converting a dormitory here at Whiteriver into a sanatorium for Apache Indians, and

WHEREAS, the Sanatorium has been badly needed for many years and the Council has repeatedly requested a sanatorium for tubercular Apache Children

NOW THEREFORE the Tribal Council desires to express its appreciation to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs and his medical staff for making a sanatorium possible. The Council urges that work proceed at the earliest practical date to remodel this building so that the sanatorium may be opened during the present fiscal year.

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 1942 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(a) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the secretary of the interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
