

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date December 6th, 1943, that:

WHEREAS, an Application for Mining Manganese and other minerals has been received from Mr. Louis A. Kuhne of Holbrook, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, these three claims are located in the Salt River Mining District on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and cover approximately sixty acres, and are known as the Accord No. 1, 2 and 3, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Kuhne has furnished the necessary bond and security and has heretofore given evidence of his good faith and intention of prosecuting the work of development and mining in order to produce minerals needed by the war effort and provide a revenue for the White Mountain Apache Tribe from royalties,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Mr. Kuhne be granted a permit for the acreage applied for.

The foregoing resolution was this 6th day of December, 1943, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1(c), Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 18 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
