RESOLUTION OF THE WEITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this date December 6th, 1945, that:

WHEREAS, an Application for Mining Manganese and other minerals has been received from Mr. Louis A. Kuehne of Holbrook, Arizona, and

WHEREAS, these three claims are located in the Salt River Mining District on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and cover approximately sixty acres, and are known as the Acord No. 1, 2 and 3, and

WHIPPRAS, Mr. Kimbine has furnished the necessary bond and security and has heretofore given evidence of his good faith and intention of prosecuting the work of development and mining in order to produce minerals needed by the war effort and provide a revenue for the White Monacain Apache Tribe from royalties.

NOW REFERE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain appared for. Euchne be granted a permit for the acreage

The foregoing resolution was this 6th day of December, 1943, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the Mainte Mauntain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1(c), Article VI of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of June 18, 1944 (48 Stat. 984).
