

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS the annual irrigation budget because of the war has been very small and barely enough to keep the present system in repair and usable condition, and

WHEREAS, our irrigation funds are practically exhausted and several of the ditches and head gates are washed out, making quite extensive repairs necessary in order to irrigate all of the lands now under irrigation for food production this coming spring and there being no other funds available.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior approve the expenditure of \$2,000 from tribal funds known as the I.I.M. fund of the Fort Apache Indians for the purpose of making repairs to head gates and diversion dams on various sections of the Reservation so that all lands now under ditch may be irrigated. The \$2,000 will be expended for Indian labor; no equipment or other repairs are involved.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 6, 1945 duly adopted 2 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI Section I (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
