

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in Special Session this 12th day of March 1945 that,

WHEREAS, the tribe is carrying on various livestock and other activities with tribal funds, because of the extra high cost of labor and forage, has insufficient I.I.M. funds to continue these operations for the remainder of the present fiscal year without serious loss to the tribe.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary be requested to approve the expenditure of the following amounts from the I.I.M. tribal funds for the following purposes:

To assist in the AAA tank construction program - - - - -	\$1200.00
To carry on livestock activities on the Reservation, principally in caring for the cattle of old people and the men in the army - - - - -	\$3300.00
For the purchase of feed and operation of tribal breeding plant - - - - -	5500.00
TOTAL AMOUNT REQUESTED - - - - -	<u>\$10,000.00</u>
Present available unincumbered balance in the I.I.M. fund	\$35,000.00

The foregoing Resolution was on March 12, 1945 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 18 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
