

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in special session this 19 day of July, 1945, that,

WHEREAS, there was sold on the 20th day of May, 1945, a certain block of timber known as the Maverick Logging Unit; and

WHEREAS, this sale did not include and grant the Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc., the privilege of using the present manufacturing location known as the town of McNary, on which the plant is located;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the attached modification of Supplemental agreement be and the same is hereby approved by the Tribal Council and the chairman, secretary and Superintendent are authorized to sign the same and forward it to the Secretary through the Indian Office with a recommendation that the same be approved.

The foregoing resolution was on this day, July 19, 1945 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI Section 1. c. of the constitution and by-laws of the tribe, ratified by the tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
