

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the headwaters areas of the North Fork of Whiteriver, on the Fort Apache Reservation, contain approximately 1,000 cords of Aspen timber.

AND WHEREAS, requests have been made for the advertisement and sale of this aspen timber,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this first day of July, 1946 that the said aspen timber be advertised at a minimum price of 75 cents per cord and sold to the highest bidder and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are hereby authorized to sign for and on behalf of said Tribe any contract covering sale of the said aspen timber.

The foregoing resolution was on July 1, 1946 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
