

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has opened the wild turkey season for the period NOVEMBER 1 to NOVEMBER 17, 1946, inclusive, and

WHEREAS, it has been our custom during past years to grant employees and local residents the privilege of hunting turkey on the Reservation,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 14th day of October, 1946, that employees and residents of the Reservation be issued permits to hunt wild turkey at a \$1.00 fee, provided that all State Laws pertaining to the hunting of wild turkey be complied with fully and that purchase of a State hunting license is pre-requisite to issuance of a Reservation Permit, and provided further; that not to exceed 25 permits be issued to employees of the Southwest Lumber Mills, Inc. of McNary, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on October 14, 1946, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
