

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular session this 9th day of June 1947, that:

WHEREAS, the Indian Police assigned to the Cibecue District of the Reservation do not have any automotive transportation and police work must all be carried out by horseback or on foot, and

WHEREAS, it is frequently necessary to transport Indians arrested to White-river for confinement, since there are no jail facilities available in the Cibecue District.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the amount of not to exceed \$1,500.00 of Tribal Funds on deposit in an individual Indian money account to the credit of the Tribe be hereby authorized for the purchase of a suitable truck for use of the Indian Police in the Cibecue District and elsewhere on the Reservation as may be required. Said truck to be used under the supervision of the Deputy Special Officer and/or Field Aide in charge of the Cibecue District.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on June 9, 1947, by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
