

RESOLUTION OF THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular session this 5th day of June 1947, that,

WHEREAS, the Council does realize that serious forest fire conditions exist annually which necessitate the use of funds for protecting the forest and range resources from fire and require that funds be made available for suppression of fires that do occur;

BE IT ENDED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that \$1,500.00 of Tribal funds now on deposit with the Treasurer of the United States be made available annually for fire suppression purposes on the Fort Apache Reservation. This authorization of the use of Tribal funds for fire suppression purposes shall remain in full force and effect beginning with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1947 and each fiscal year thereafter until revoked by the Tribal Council, provided that these Tribal funds will not be used for fire suppression or forest and range fires unless no other funds are available.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on June 5, 1947, by a vote of 7 for and 2 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and by-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1948, pursuant to Section 18 of the Act of June 15, 1934 (48 Stat. 954).
