

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation in regular session this 8th day of July, 1947, that

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council authorized on February 3, 1947, the detailing of two Indian Court Judges and two Indian Policemen to attend the Judges and policemen's school to be held in connection with the Indian Service Summer School at Santa Fe, New Mexico, August 4, 1947,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that funds to cover the travel and board and room expenses of the judges and policemen detailed to this school are hereby authorized to be paid from court funds now on deposit in individual Indian money account at the Fort Apache Agency to the credit of the tribe

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in addition to travel expenses the Associate Judge of the Cibecue District shall be paid \$5.00 per day wages since said Judge is only paid on a per diem basis when actually holding court.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted on July 8, 1947, by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
