

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation, that,

WHEREAS, it is desired to offer opportunities to qualified Indians to receive training and experience in police work in order to have an opportunity to accept responsible positions in police work, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to have a qualified Special Officer in charge of all police work on the Fort Apache reservation in the absence of an available qualified Indian for the position,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in special meeting assembled this 16th day of August, 1947, that the position of Deputy Special Officer, formerly position No. 1A.9a, is hereby authorized to be paid from Tribal funds on deposit with the Fort Apache Agency, and the position is to be set up on the same basis and with the same salary as a Civil Service position in Civil Service Grade CAF-6, effective July 30, 1947, said incumbent of the position to be responsible to and to work under the direct supervision of the Superintendent or other officer in charge of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such additional police positions be established as required to give adequate police personnel to the reservation, said police to be employed under rules governing entrance salary and promotions as may be adopted by the Tribal Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Deputy Special Officer is to be employed under an agreement and chairman of the Council is hereby authorized to sign said agreement for the council,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 218 is hereby revoked.

The foregoing resolution was this 16th day of August, 1947, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1(d), Article VI of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.).
