RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Be it resolved by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that,

In order to protect wild life resources on the reservation, all hunting of wild life within the reservation boundaries are hereby prohibited except as provided for by Resolution No. 222 and Resolution No. 224 for the 1947 hunting season unless otherwise provided for by the adoption of an ordinance regulating hunting and fishing within the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on October 10, 1947, duly adopted by a vote of a for and against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (P), of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
