


RESOLUTION
of the
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
of the
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


No. 235

WHEREAS THERE IS NEED OF ADDITIONAL JAIL FACILITIES AT THE FORT APACHE AGENCY-At Whiteriver for women prisoners as the present facilities for women prisoners is small, inadequate and without proper sanitary facilities, now

THEFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in special session this 19th. day of January, 1948 that the construction of a new jail for women prisoners is considered . . . advisable and desirable and therefore there is hereby authorized and appropriated the sum of \$1500.00 from general Tribal and/or Tribal Court funds for the construction of a suitable jail for women prisoners at Whiteriver, Arizona; provided that male prisoners shall be used in so far as possible for labor in constructing said jail building, so that the funds made available for the building may be used for the purchase of required materials and equipment; provided further that modern jail plumbing and other equipment shall be used and also that the plans for the building shall be approved by the Tribal Council and the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency only after consultation with the District Construction Engineer.

The foregoing resolution Number 235 was on January 19, 1948 duly adopted by a vote of 5 for and none against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 17, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 924).
