

RESOLUTION
of the
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
of the
FORT APACHE RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation this 1st day of November, 1948, that

The request of the Navopache Electric Cooperative for a right-of-way 60 ft. in width from Melary, Arizona northeast to the north boundary of the reservation for use of an electric transmission line is hereby approved, subject to the regulations pertaining to the granting of rights-of-way across Indian tribal lands, and the granting of such right-of-way shall grant the Navopache Electric Cooperative, its officers and employees, its successors and assigns the right of egress and ingress to said right-of-way, so long as said right-of-way easement shall be in effect and used exclusively for purposes set forth in the application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that damages to standing timber and tribal land are hereby waived provided any merchantable timber cleared from said right-of-way shall be cut into commercial logs of designated lengths and shall remain the property of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on November 1, 1948, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
