RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on August 7, 1950, our Tribal Council adopted a motion that we have our Superintendent write a letter to the officials at Steilacoom, Washington, requesting the pardon or parole of SILAS JOHNS EDWARDS, who has been imprisoned there for nearly seventeen (17) years, he being approximately seventy (70) years of age, that he might be returned to his people here to spend his few remaining years, and

WHEREAS, no results were obtained, and our Council still being most anxious to have our beloved brother SILAS JOHNS EDWARDS, paroled and returned to us;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we renew our request for the pardon or parole of SILAS JOHNS EDWARDS, that he may be returned here to his Whiteriver Indian Agency Home; that such parole be to our Tribal Council and that a copy of this Resolution be spread upon our minutes and a copy sent to the Attorney General of the United States of America, at Washington, D. C., either direct or by and through Messrs. Robert I. McOhee and D. B. Rienhardt, attorneys at law, Globe, Arizona, who have kindly agreed to lend their assistance in this matter in order that the application of our friend and brother SILAS JOHNS EDWARDS, may receive proper attention.
