BrickAAS, on August 7, 1950, our Tribal Council adopted a motion that we have our Superintendent write a letter to the efficials at Stellacoom, Sashington, requesting the parden or purole or SILAS JUHNS EDMARDS, who has neen imprisoned there for nearly seventeen (17) years, he being approximately seventy (70) years of age, that he might be returned to his peonis here to spend his few remaining years, and

WHEREAS, no results were obtained, and our Council still being most anxious to have our believed brother SILAS JUHNS EDWARDS, pareled and returned to us;

MOA, THEREFORE, BE IT RECOLVED, that we renew our request for the parties of SILAS JOHNS EDNARIES, that he may be returned here to his Whiteriver Indian Agency Home; that such parels be to our Tribal Council and that a copy of this Mesolution be spread upon our minutes and a copy sent to the Attorney General of the United States of Americas, at Rashington, D. C., either direct or by and through Mesors. Rebert E. McChee and D. E. Rienhardt, attorneys at law, Globe, Arisona, who have kindly agreed to lend their assistance in this matter in order that the application of our firend and brother SILAS JUHNS LDMARUS, may receive proper attention.
