

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as follows:

1. That beginning on 10 September 1951 the mileage paid to members of the tribal council be increased from 5¢ to 7¢ per mile for attendance at all tribal and committee meetings, and the compensation for attendance at such meetings shall be increased as follows:
 - a. from \$8.00 to \$12.00 per day, or fraction thereof, for attendance at tribal council meetings; and
 - b. to \$6.00 per half day, or fraction thereof, for attendance at committee meetings.

2. That the mileage paid to the chairman of the tribal council shall be increased from 5¢ to 7¢ per mile (when driving his own car as distinguished from the car belonging to the tribe on official business of the tribe), and his compensation shall be increased from \$200.00 to \$250.00 per month payable at two-week intervals beginning with the two-week period running from September 2 to 15, inclusive, which will become payable on 27 September 1951.

The foregoing Resolution was on the 11th day of September, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
