

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS IT IS RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Resolution No. 51-15, adopted by the Council on May 14, 1951, is hereby amended as follows:

1. Paragraph No. 4 is amended to read; "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the amount authorized in the budget for any specific item may be increased by not to exceed twenty per centum (20%) from savings accruing from any other item or items, PROVIDED such transfer of funds is approved in writing by the Chairman (or acting Chairman) of the Tribal Council."
2. Section I (a) of the budget is amended to read; "(a) Salary of Chairman. \$2400 per annum effective July 1, 1951, increased to \$3000 per annum, effective September 2, 1951, including employer's Social Security and Unemployment Insurance taxes. \$3100.
3. Section I (b) of the budget is amended to read; "(b) Pay of members, regular and special meetings. Effective July 1, 1951, nine members at \$8.00 each per day, estimated 3 days at \$72.00--\$216.00; Effective September 10, 1951, nine members at \$12.00 each per day, estimated 15 days at \$108.00--\$1620; Travel expense on authorized trips of committees and members and pay of special committees at above rates--\$2164; Expenses of Indians for 1952, Indian Service Summer School--\$1000. \$5000.
4. Section II of the budget is amended to read; "Secretary to the Council, salary to be identical to that of Government grade GS-3, Step 1, plus employer's Social Security and Unemployment Insurance taxes \$3100.
Accounting Clerk, salary to be identical to Government grade GS-5, step 2, plus employer's Social Security and Unemployment Insurance taxes \$3700.
Assistant Accounting Clerk, salary to be identical to Government grade GS-3, step 1, plus employer's Social Security and Unemployment Insurance taxes and maintenance of quarters \$1350.
Total \$10,150."

5. Section III is amended to provide an additional item as follows:
 (c) Purchase and installation of two mobile two-way radio units in police cars and one master unit in the tribal police office, to be operated in cooperation with the State and County law enforcement agencies \$1500.
6. Section VI (e) of the budget is amended to read;
 "(e) Predatory Animal Control. Includes salary and expenses of trapper under agreement with the Fish and Wildlife Service (salary \$3225. and expenses \$900.) and for bounties to Indian and authorized trappers for destroying predators Total \$9000.
7. Section I (c) of the budget is amended to read;
 "Tribal employees quarters. To construct one new four-room cottage for housing tribal employees, including furniture and equipment, \$9500. To purchase one available cottage, repair and complete same and purchase necessary furniture and equipment \$9500. Total \$19,000."
8. Section VI. Item (a) of the budget is amended to read;
 "Fencing Projects \$18,400.
1. Boundary Fence
 2. Carrise - Cibeus fence
 3. Black River fence in Cedar Creek District
 4. Fence at Sheep Springs to separate cattle range
 5. Soldier Spring trap
 6. Black River fence in Canyon Lay District
 7. Fence maintenance between association ranges
 8. Stockyard construction at McNary and Sheep Springs shipping pens
 9. Maintain and repair fences in prescribed burn areas, pastures, etc.
 10. New fences needed to properly use pastures above McNary, including Paradise, Tom Reed or Coulter areas, etc.
 11. Cattle guard at Roberts Ranch."
9. Section VI. Item (e) of the budget is amended to read;
 "(e) Juniper Control \$60,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby authorized and appropriated from tribal funds on deposit in an Individual Indian Money Account with Fort Apache Agency the additional sum of forty-five thousand five hundred twenty-five dollars (\$45,525.) to cover the above increases authorized.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1939, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 944).
