

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Pat Gruwell, of Young, Arizona, who holds the timber contract for the Lost Tank Canyon Unit has petitioned on February 13, 1951 for relief from meeting the cutting requirements of one million (1,000,000) board feet to be done by March 31, 1951, and,

WHEREAS, it is recognized that this contractor had a late start in operating in 1950 and that he is in a difficult logging and hauling area,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 5th day of March, 1951 that the Area Director be authorized to act in his judgement to relieve the contractor and that the date of March 31, 1952 be set by which time one million five hundred thousand (1,500,000) board feet be paid for and cut, and that all remaining timber be paid for and cut by the expiration date of March 31, 1953 as it is now stated in the contract.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are hereby authorized to sign for and in behalf of the said Tribe said relief from cutting.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 5, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
