WHEREAS, the Arizona State Highway Department desires to improve and reconstruct a portion of State Highway No. 73 (Mon-FaS-Project 215) between Whiteriver and Indian Pine, within the Fort Abadhe Indian Reservation that, consent of the Council of the White Mountain Abadhe Tribe for a right-of-way for said portion in accordance with right-of-way man submitted is hereby granted. Said nighway being the portion of old J. S. Highway No. 60 now designated as State Highway No. 73 lying between the town of Whiteriver and Indian Pine.

BE IT F RTUER RESOLVED that this approval is granted with the provision that no trees except within the construction area of the nighway may be out, removed, or camaged.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 16, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on Almst 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (43 Stat. 984).

## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation that Resolution No. 51-8 adopted and approved on March 16, 1951 be amended to read as follows:

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Highway Department desires to improve and reconstruct a portion of State Highway No. 73 (Non-FAS-Project 215) between Fort Apache Junction and Indian Pine, within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation that, consent of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for a right-of-way for said portion in accordance with right-of-way map submitted is hereby granted. Said highway being the portion of old U. S. Highway No. 60 now designated as State Highway No. 73 lying between the town of Fort Apache Junction and Indian Pine.

HE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this approval is granted with the provision that no trees except within the construction area of the highway may be cut, removed, or damaged.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 7, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe en August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
