

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on Cerro Gordo Mountain there is timber that was not logged in 1928 when operations were active at that time,

AND WHEREAS, this area of about 400 acres will not produce new timber until the old mature trees are removed.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this area be surveyed for its timber volume that can be removed for best productive use of the land. This timber to be advertised for not less than \$12.00 per M.B.M. and that thirty dollars (\$30.00) be made available for newspaper advertisement.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 9, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
