


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, because of low prices received for cattle, the General Livestock Board has not been able to collect sufficient funds through assessments to provide an adequate budget for the coming year even though the rate of assessment was increased from 8% to 12%, and


WHEREAS, the operation of the livestock industry on the reservation is vital to the economic well being of the tribal members, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the sum of five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500.00) is hereby appropriated from tribal funds on deposit in the S. D. A. Accounts of the Fort Apache Agency for the purchase of a stock truck for use by the General Livestock Board. Trade in or sale of the present truck is authorized and any net savings resulting shall revert to the General tribal account.

The foregoing Resolution was on December 7, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
