

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe owns and operates the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise for the purpose of regulating fishing, camping, hunting and other recreation activities on the reservation and for the conservation and protection of reservation wildlife through enforcement of Tribal Hunting and Fishing Code, Ordinance No. 14, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe desires to expand the operations of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise through development of recreation facilities and tourist accommodations and other related projects which will bring additional income to the Tribe and Indian people, and

WHEREAS, an extensive plan of operation for the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise has been adopted by the Tribe which will require the services of a competent manager to carry out and the Tribe desires to employ a manager, under contract to the Tribe, for the operation of the Enterprise, and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive Management Contract for the operation of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise has been drawn up in detail, satisfactory to the Tribe, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Management Contract for the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise be adopted as written for the employment of a manager for the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise.

The foregoing Resolution was on December 8, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (p) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
