


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of the urgent need of a local pistol, shotgun and rifle range where Tribal Police, Game Wardens of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise, members of the Whiteriver Civic Club and other residents of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation may target sheet without endangering the lives and property of others, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Police, White Mountain Recreation Enterprise and the Whiteriver Civic Club have agreed to construct and maintain jointly a shooting range located approximately one-mile Northeast of Kinishba Ruin in Township 5 North, Range 22 East, Section 17, SWSW 1/4, on which the firing of guns will be in a northerly direction into an earth backstop constructed for the purpose

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by this Council, that the Tribal Police, White Mountain Recreation Enterprise and the Whiteriver Civic Club be permitted to use an Area 600 feet by 600 feet of Tribal lands located in Township 5 North, Range 22 East, Section 17, SWSW 1/4, for a Target range.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 10, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VIII of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
