RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE HOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware that unusual weather conditions have prevailed the past three months, and
- WHEREAS, high winds during this period have blewn down green trees and snags across back reads and fire trails, and
- WHEREAS, such reads and trails will be urgently needed at the beginning of the coming fire season for fire suppression travel, and
- WHEREAS, there remains a balance of \$2,105.42 in the fund W-91-83 Herse Trail Maintenance, Fiscal year 1952, and
- WHEREAS, approximately \$3,000.00 will be needed for the hire of labor and transportation in clearing back reads and fire trails this spring,
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by this Council, that the balance of \$2,105.42 in the fund W-91-83, Herse Trail Maintenance be centimued and available for this purpose through the balance of Fiscal Year 1953.

The foregoing Resolution was on March 10, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
