- able mountain accept, over 300 miles of trout streams, many small lakes and ponds, campground, summer cottage, cabin, motel, service station, commercial fish pond sites and other resources which offer an almost unlimited potential contribution to the economy of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- Apache Indian Reservation sustain many habitant wildlife and other natural resources important to the economy of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- tion's wildlife, undeveloped recreation areas and other natural resources which through proper development and expansion would contribute greatly to the Tribe's economy for an indefinite time, therefore
- Of Operation of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Plan of Operation of the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise be adopted as written for the purpose of conservation of wildlife and natural resources of the White Mountain Apache Reservation and development of such recreation facilities and tourist accommodations and related projects on the reservation for use by the Tribe and general public, which will contribute to the economy of the Indian people, and
- THE RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Council is authorized to execute and sign the plan for and on behalf of the Tribe and to accept any conditions of approval thereof which he may deem appropriate.

The foregoing Resolution was on August 3, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to aut ority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (p) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Resolution No. 53-49, adopted December 8, 1954, is hereby rescinded.
