

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the East Fork Timber Unit and Management Plan was completed and approved by the Superintendent on July 30, 1951, and has since been approved by the Area Office and submitted to the Central Office for final approval, and

WHEREAS, this plan indicates that a permanent annual supply of four million board feet is available at any time utilization may commence, and

WHEREAS, considerable time must pass until consultant's recommendations regarding the enlargement of the Tribal Sawmill Enterprise are made and until new plant construction is completed,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Central Office expedite their study of the East Fork Timber Unit Management Plan and that Resolution No. 166, dated July 29, 1946, be hereby amended to permit timber sales to be made in accordance with regulations until such time as the Tribal Sawmill Enterprise is prepared to take over utilization of this timber; Provided that not more than eight million feet be sold at any one time, and Provided that said sales shall be confined to the areas presenting the more difficult logging chance.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 1, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
