

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

Resolution No. 55-26

WHEREAS, there is an increasing need for better recreational and other community services at Whiteriver, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to assist in providing these facilities,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the sum of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000.00) be hereby appropriated from tribal funds on deposit with the Treasurer of the United States for the construction and equipping a building at Whiteriver consisting of a cafe, beauty shop, barber shop, Post office, bowling alley and billiard room, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such of the above facilities as may be determined by the Council may be leased to competent operators.

The foregoing Resolution was on August 1, 1955 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
