

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation upon different occasions has discussed the need for joining the National Congress of American Indians, and

WHEREAS, it is becoming more apparent by the members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that only through united effort can the rights and the properties of the White Mountain Apache Tribe of Indians be protected, and

WHEREAS, the National Congress of American Indians has done much to protect such rights and properties of Indian tribes throughout the country

BE IT RESOLVED, that the White Mountain Apache Tribe of Indians join the National Congress of American Indians on a permanent basis at the rate of one hundred eighty-five dollars (\$185.00) per year membership dues until revoked for just reason, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the membership dues for the White Mountain Apache tribe be paid from their tribal funds for the current year (1955) on the basis of one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) plus one and one-half cents (1½¢) per person for enrolled members.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 28, 1955, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section () of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
