RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is located on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation certain large manganese deposits which heretofore have not been productive due to the ore having a high copper content, and
- WHEREAS, said claims are commonly known as the Noel No. 1 through 6 and are located approximately two miles south from the Medicine Ranch House on the said reservation, and
- WHEREAS, Ralph Henderson and Virgil Burke of Gila County, Globe, Arizona, have proved satisfactorily to the Tribal Council that they can economically process said manganese ore.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that Ralph Henderson and Virgil Burke have a mining lease covering the above described claims is hereby approved without advertising
 and the Chairman of the Tribal Council is authorized to sign the said
 lease for and on behalf of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1958 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
