RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe passed Tribal Resolution No. 222 September 8, 1947 in which a fee for "Reservation Elk Permit" costing \$10.00 was established for those individuals possessing a valid State Elk Hunting Permit, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a big game management plan in effect and miscellaneous administration services have increased greatly in recent years.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Tribal Resolution No. 222 dated September 8, 1947 be amended as follows: Only those individuals possessing a "State Big Game Hunting License" and also a "Reservation Elk Hunting Permit" costing \$15.00 are eligible to hunt on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and PROVIDED further that all hunters on the Reservation must comply fully with State Laws pertaining to the hunting of elk.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 1958 duly adopted by a vote of
