

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a demand for oak converter poles to be used to refine copper by the mining companies in Arizona, and

WHEREAS, permit sales and the sampling therefrom have been made for this purpose which tends to prove that oak from this reservation is suitable for refining copper and that therefore contract sales should be planned.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session that an oak logging unit area, to be specified in a contract, be appraised for advertisement and sale according to regulations and that Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) be made available for newspaper advertisement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of this Council be authorized to sign a contract covering the sale of said timber.

The foregoing resolution was on September 3, 1958, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b), (f) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
