RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal income, due to the declining lumber market and prices, has decreased, and

WHEREAS, in order to compensate for this loss of income it is necessary that the Tribe further develop its own industrial potentials, and

WHEREAS, there are few remaining advantageous business sites existing on the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session that all highway junctions, corner lots and other business sites be reserved for the Tribal Enterprise and withdrawn for issue for Traders Permits.

The foregoing resolution was on September 5, 1958, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (c), (e), (h), (i) and (m) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
