

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Western States Telephone Company, Inc., with office and principal place of business at Holbrook, Arizona, has requested a right of way for telephone lines from the White Mountain Apache Tribe 20 feet in width and 86.508 miles in length across Indian trust lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Navajo and Gila County, State of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will benefit by the construction of said telephone lines.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a right of way 20 feet in width and 86.508 miles in length, as described and delineated on Maps 2 through 8, which are on file in the office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Agency, is hereby granted to the Western States Telephone Company, Inc., and that the Chairman of the Council be authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to effectuate said right of way.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the length of the right of way as shown above may be adjusted due to a portion of the telephone lines being constructed on lands owned in fee by the Lutheran Church, 44.118 acres, the boundaries of which are undetermined.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all damages be waived as the Tribe will benefit by the construction of the telephone lines.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right of way agreement is subject to condition subsequent that the telephone company extend to the subscribers toll free service between the Whiteriver exchange and the Pinetop-Lakeside exchange and subject to the further condition subsequent that the said company establish a microwave toll circuit installation from Holbrook to Smith Park and establish toll free service between Whiteriver and said Smith Park.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
