

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 61-83, August 3, 1961 authorized the appraisal of a logging unit in survey units 5 or 6 to replace Limestone Logging Unit which is nearing completion, and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 1962 said appraisal was reviewed by the Area Director for an area designated as the Jump Off Canyon No. 1 Logging Unit containing 14,334,000 board of timber to be cut and recommends the following minimum prices for advertisement:

Ponderosa and Mexican White Pine	\$9.00 per M.B.F.
Douglas fir	5.20 per M.B.F.
White fir	3.00 per M.B.F.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 61-84, August 3, 1961 authorized the preparation of a logging unit in Survey Unit No. 1 in the Canyon Creek area of the reservation, and

WHEREAS, on March 5, 1962 the Area Director reviewed the appraisal of the Canyon Creek No. 1 Logging Unit and recommends the following minimum stumpage prices for advertisement:

Ponderosa and Mexican white pine	\$8.00 per M.B.F.
Douglas fir	5.00 per M.B.F.
White fir	2.50 per M.B.F.

BE IT RESOLVED that the above mentioned units be advertised in accordance with regulations for oral auction bids at the prices stated above, and that the Chairman and Secretary of the Tribal Council be authorized to sign contracts covering sale of the above timber.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
