

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, vegetation modification programs on the Cibecue Livestock Association Range Unit have resulted in the introduction of new grass species, and
- WHEREAS, to insure the successful establishment of these species the areas on which they are seeded must be deferred for several seasons, and
- WHEREAS, the cattle that normally graze these areas cannot use them during the deferment period, and
- WHEREAS, the Cibecue Livestock Association does not wish to overload the balance of their range unit during the deferment period, and
- WHEREAS, the Cibecue Livestock Association voluntarily reduced their herd prior to the start of the vegetation modification program, and
- WHEREAS, the Cibecue Livestock Association has cooperated in assuring complete deferment of areas where required, and
- WHEREAS, a portion of the Mt. Baldy Wildlife Reserve in the vicinity of Bear Cieniga and Paradise Creek could be used for livestock during the deferment period.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Cibecue Livestock Association be authorized to graze, not to exceed three hundred (300) animal units, in the Mt. Baldy Wildlife Reserve in the area of Bear Cieniga and Paradise Creeks. These cattle are to be grazed in strict compliance to a range use plan to be prepared by the Branch of Land Operations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no lien grazing fees shall be charged as the Cibecue Association is within its present authorized capacity and this modification is not an authorization to exceed the present authorized capacity but merely an arrangement to replace land being deferred.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this modification to assist the Cibecue Association shall be in effect June 1, 1962 to April 30, 1964.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 98).
