

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a need for a delegation of Council members to visit Washington, D.C. to discuss tribal problems and programs with appropriate government officials, and


WHEREAS, it is necessary that Albert M. Hawley, Superintendent, because of his vast knowledge of the needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, accompany said group.

BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that Albert M. Hawley, Fort Apache Agency Superintendent, Barry De Rose, Tribal Attorney, Lester Oliver, Chairman, and Fred Banashley, Vice-Chairman, be delegated to represent the Tribal Council at Washington, D.C. during the period of June 17, 1962 through June 22, 1962.

BE IT RESOLVED that the itemized statement of objectives to be accomplished in Washington are attached hereto and made a part of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1962, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section I (a) and (c) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
