

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, in anticipating the expenses of publishing the Fort Apache Scout the Tribal Council was of the opinion that funds received from advertising would defray the costs of publishing same, and

WHEREAS, it has been impossible to secure an advertising salesman, and

WHEREAS, the expenses of publishing the Scout was paid out of the Public Relations Account, and

WHEREAS, the sum of \$3,644.67 has been expended from said Public Relations Fund to publish the Scout, and

WHEREAS, the Treasurer can effectuate a savings of approximately \$9,500 from other budgetary items.

BE IT RESOLVED that there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$9,500 to defray the cost of publishing the Fort Apache Scout for the current fiscal year.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Treasurer is hereby directed to effectuate a savings in the approximate sum of \$9,500 from other budgetary items, such items to be approved by the Chairman.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the income from advertising and savings in budgetary items shall not exceed the sum of \$9,500.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Relations Fund is to be reimbursed the sum of \$3,644.67, being the amount of money expended from said funds as of this date to publish the Fort Apache Scout.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1962 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 62-24 adopted May 2, 1962, A. G. Peterson and J. H. Webb were ordered to remove all of their machinery and equipment from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, said resolution further provided that Eldon Stratton was authorized to use the area previously occupied by A. G. Peterson to construct a sawmill thereon and to use slab pit previously constructed by A. G. Peterson, and

WHEREAS, Eldon Stratton has not provided the saved lumber necessary to keep the Tribal Planing Mill in full production, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe is in need of funds and can realize the increased revenue from increased production at the planing mill, and

WHEREAS, Jensen Brothers has offered to reactivate the old Petersen sawmill, and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that this reactivation will supply the necessary lumber to keep the planing mill at full production.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman and the Secretary are hereby directed to enter into a contract with Jensen Brothers for the furnishing of lumber to the Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company Planing Mill and paying the said Jensen Brothers therefor the sum of \$38.45 per thousand board feet.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said contract is to continue in effect until the new Fort Apache Timber Company sawmill is in production or until terminated by mutual agreement between the Tribe and Jensen Brothers; however, said contract not to exceed one year from the date hereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Jensen Brothers is hereby authorized to deck logs at the Petersen sawmill site in adjacent areas and to further have the right to ingress and egress to and from the Peterson sawmill and the further right to have joint use of the slab pit with Eldon Stratton.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all pertinent parts of Resolution No. 62-24 that are in conflict with this resolution are hereby rescinded.
