RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is presently no community facilities at Carrizo for use as a medical center, and
- WHEREAS, the Council has previously expressed a desire to construct a community building as soon as funds can be made available, and
- WHEREAS, the U. S. Public Health Service desires to hold well baby clinic and to make regular visits, and
- WHEREAS, temporary facilities are needed to provide medical services for the Carrizo people.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the sum of not to exceed \$1000.00 is hereby appropriated from tribal funds now on deposit in the U. S. Treasury to purchase a trailer to be used as a temporary medical center for Carrizo.

The foregoing resolution was on November 10, 1964 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
