

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Master Forest Management Plan approved March 3, 1963, allows cutting of old growth timber in the amount of 59.9 million board feet from January 1, 1961, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to plan the cutting schedules for the four Blocks of the Reservation Forest for the next three to five years in order that the mills concerned can make proper plans.
