

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 64-121, November 10, 1964, authorized the North Fork Oak No. 7 Logging Unit at a stumpage rate of \$3.50 per cord, and

WHEREAS, the North Fork Oak Logging Units have operated to some extent in conflict with the Tribal recreational program in the North Fork area such as cutting near camp sites and hazards of log hauling.

BE IT RESOLVED that in lieu of oak sales in the North Fork area, the Carrizo Oak Logging Unit be established, and that the Carrizo Oak No. 1 Logging Unit be prepared for advertisement of 1,000 cords according to regulations under the following conditions:

- (a) That the same minimum stumpage rate of \$3.50 per cord as recommended by the Area Forester November 10, 1964, be approved.
- (b) That the contract be approved subject to minor changes by the Approving Officer.
- (c) That the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to execute the contract and any necessary extensions or modifications for and in behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the net proceeds from the sale of this timber be deposited to the credit of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on February 11, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
