RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has unanimously voted to participate in the Pre School Program, Adult Education Program, Coordinators, Recreation, Physical fitness, Elementary Counselling, Child Care, Apache Culture Center, Trachoma Eradication, Resident Nurse and Neighborhood Youth Corps Program under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe will need the assistance and guidance of the U. S. Public Health Service in effectuating these said programs.

BE IT RESOLVED that the U. S. Public Health Service is hereby requested to assist the Tribe and Bureau of Indian Affairs in establishing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in any manner possible of the abovenamed programs of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 for which the said U. S. Public Health Service is staffed to so assist.

The foregoing resolution was on April 7, 1965 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Triba, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Triba, ratified by the Triba June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
